Convention Speech

Good evening, everyone, thank you for coming here tonight to be part of this important event.

My name is Christopher Richards and I seek **your vote** to be next Republican representative on the Williamson County Commission.

I met a lot of you between February and April of this year as I went door to door in your neighborhood, meeting you on your doorstep, looking you in the eye and telling you about why I am the best choice for County

Commissioner in District 7. More importantly, I listened.

I spent time hearing about your hopes and concerns.

Your frustration with the County Debt, Brentwood Middle

I lost the May 3rd primary to Bert Chalfant by only 11 votes. 11 votes out of 2200. I petitioned for a recount because the margins were less than 1%. I challenged the election the way I challenge the status quo.

Sadly, Bert Chalfant passed away a few weeks ago, just as he was finishing up his 36th year in office. And that is why we are here today – to determine who is the best Republican candidate to move on to the November 8th special election, to represent the people of District 7.

For those of you who may not have been home when I knocked on your door, my platform is simple: the responsibility of a County Commissioner is to be a wise steward of taxpayer dollars. There is no reason for our county to be \$1 billion in debt. Our commissioners have lacked the discipline and responsibility to say no to wasteful spending. To say "no" to shelling out nearly \$3 million for the Renaissance Festival, or \$14 million for a new animal shelter, while our police and fire departments remain under-funded and understaffed.
